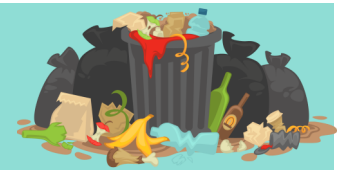

If requesting assistance, please ensure the following:

- Items are sorted into piles (ie. Recyclables, wood waste, etc)
- Absolutely no hazardous waste is included (ie paints, solvents etc). These items will be left behind.

If you are unsure if your items are eligible for pick-up, please contact the Village Office.

### REPORT ALL POACHERS & POLLUTERS (RAPP)

The RAPP program allows you to report known or suspected violations of fisheries, wildlife, or environmental protection laws anonymously and without risk of confronting the offender.

Environmental violations to report include:

- Illegal waste disposal (household or business waste, e.g. dumped in the bush)
- Unlawful open burning (e.g. dense smoke); excludes backyard burning
- The discharge of chemicals or sewage to lakes or rivers
- Damage to fish or wildlife habitat
- Exceeding the daily bag or catch limit
- Use of illegal hunting or fishing gear
- Fishing or hunting out of season or in closed areas
- Unauthorized collection or sale of fish and wildlife or their parts

Excerpts from the Zeballos Miner Newspaper from May 9, 1938-



#### BANK ARRIVES IN CAMP

A Bank of Commerce has established in the Zeballos Developments Building on Main St., opposite Nelson Brothers general store. Yet another sign of the growing importance of Zeballos as a mining town and another tribute to the enterprise of the banking institution. The Bank of Commerce has pioneered almost all of BC's mining camps. But there were many times when it did not, as easily as in Zeballos, get into a modern building in which there are all the comforts of the city.

#### ZEBALLOS JAIL HOUSE COMPLETED

Contractors have completed construction of the smallest building that will serve as the jail. It is a nice jail, but the cells have not arrived yet. There are no customers, anyway, so the police are not worrying. Zeballos is a well behaved town, and a jail has not really been necessary, yet. But every town has its jail.
