### HISTORY CORNER

An excerpt from the Zeballos Miner Newspaper October 17, 1938—

#### LOGS JAM RIVER

“Zeballos River, swollen by the first heavy rain of the season, overflowed its banks, cut across the road and joined the sea via the slough where it battled furiously with the tide.

The low-lying part of town and the highway where the break occurred were under more than a foot of water for several days.

No actual damage was done but great inconvenience was caused. Jack Grausan's bakery and store building<sup>1</sup> became an island during the storm and residents of the vicinity had to take to their boots.

Logs, debris and bars combined make the river a menace.”
