SEPTEMBER 6

BCWS classifies fire as "being held" indicating sufficient suppression action has been taken and the fire is unlikely to spread beyond the existing boundary.

SEPTEMBER 8

BCWS classifies fire as "under control" indicating the fire has received sufficient suppression action to ensure no further spread.

Based on recommendation from Tom Millard, MoFLNRORD, Evacuation Order expanded to include: all houses North of Sugarloaf Bridge; All houses on East side of Maquinna Avenue and North of Pandora Crescent: All houses on Pandora Crescent that are East of Maguinna Avenue; and house numbers 402-B, 404 and 406 Ferris Road, due to notential debris flow and slides.
